Goodbye park, Hello playground

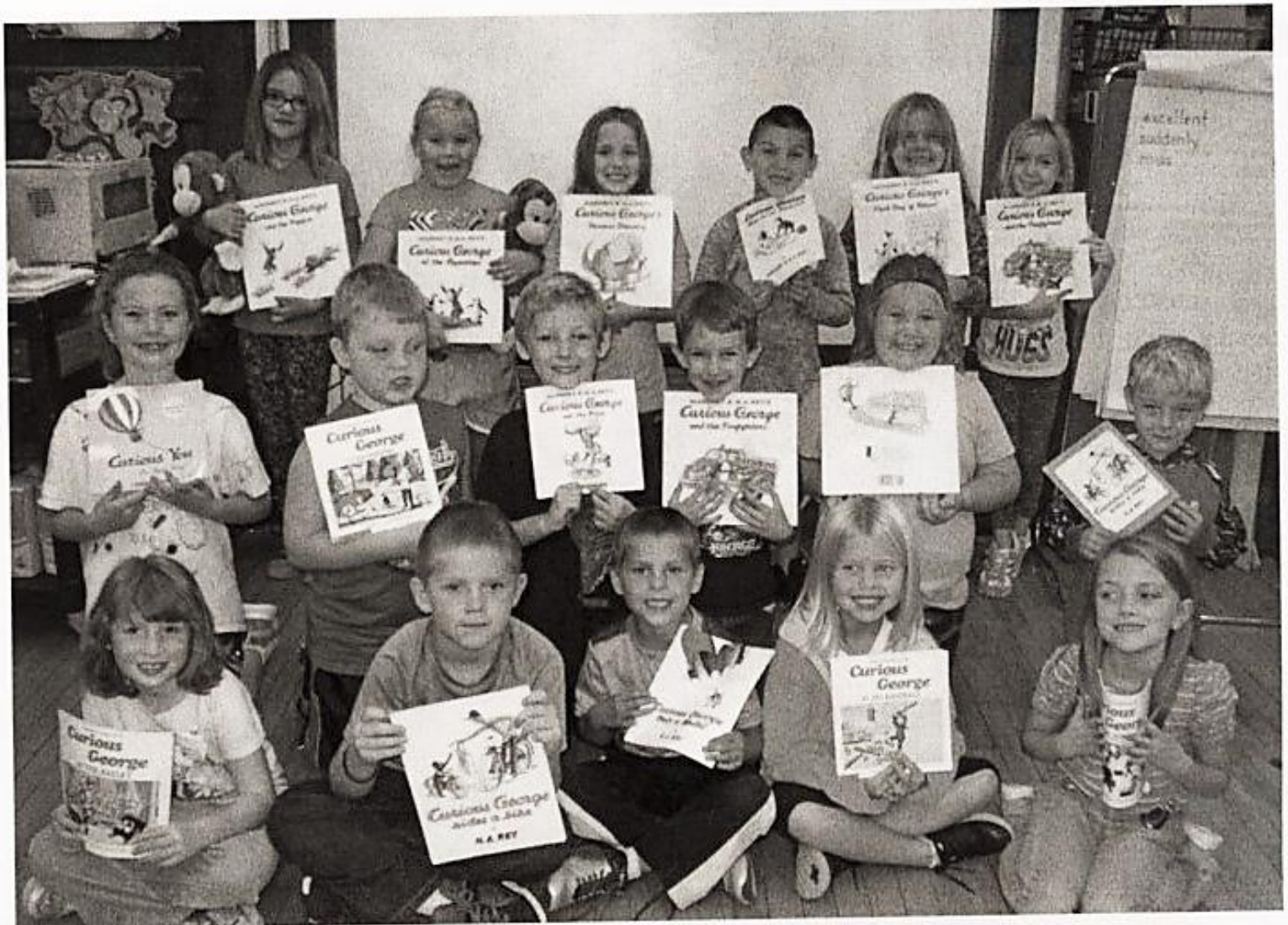

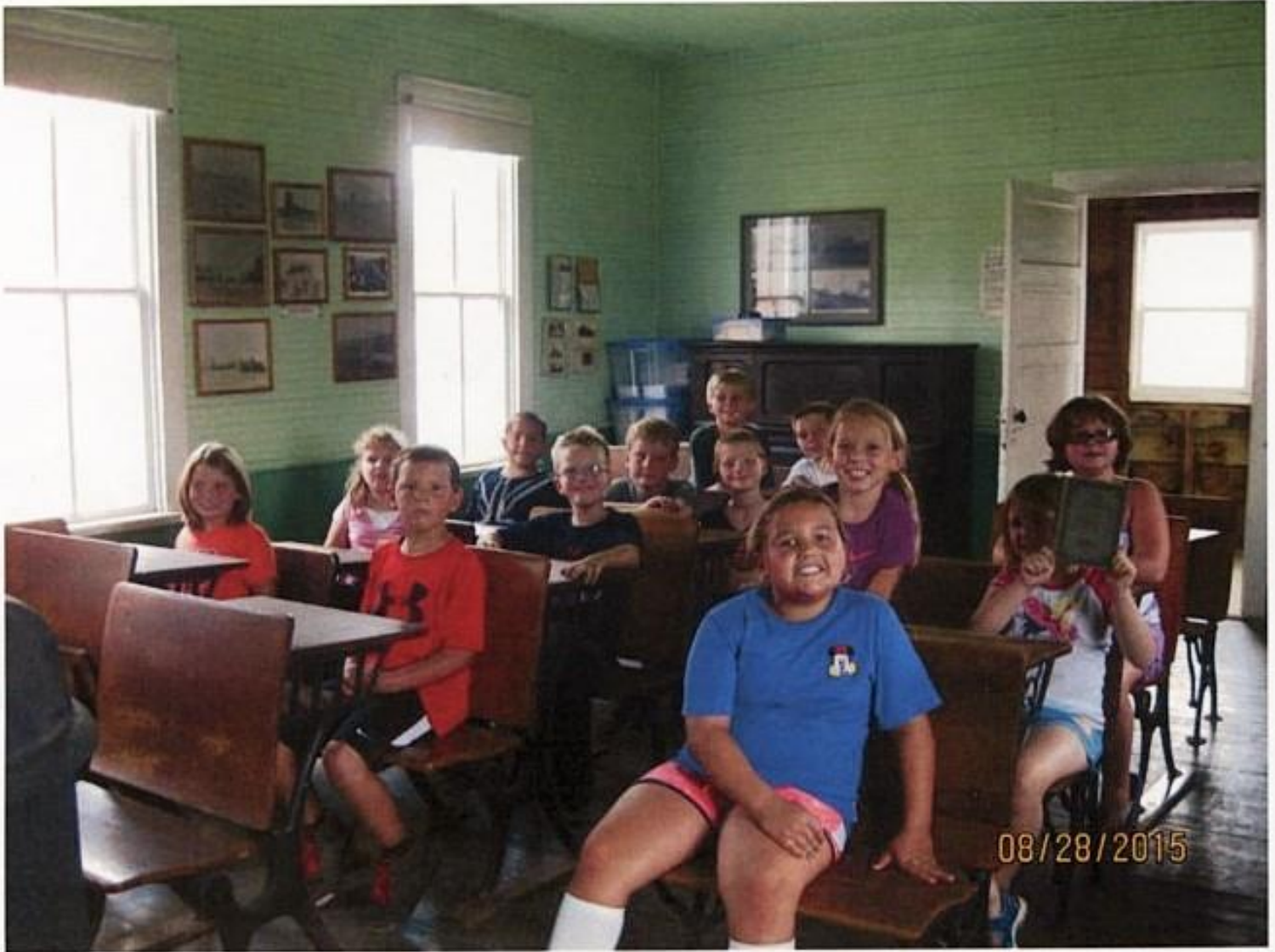
## THIRD GRADE OUTING
