

Jaguar Walk:

- H= Head and body face forward
- A= Arms down at your sides
- L= Level 0 Voice
- L= Leave space in front

Leveled Voices:

- 0= zero voice, no talking
- 1= whisper voice, partner talk
- 2= normal voice, table talk
- 3= loud and proud, classroom talk
- 4= outside voice, playground talk


Football season is off and running, this year's Jags are led by these seniors pictured left: Caysen, Kalym, Jaden, Blake, Brady and Evan.

STAND UP FOR SCHOOL SAFETY.

ANONYMOUSLY TEXT 'SAFE' TO 82257

**TO REPORT SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOR
THREATS OR VIOLENCE.**

Project StandUp for School Safety Program being Introduced

Associated School Boards of South Dakota and the School Administrators of South Dakota have joined the South Dakota's Chiefs and Sheriffs Association, Project StandUp and the South Dakota Attorney General's Office to bring **an anonymous tipping platform for school violence** to South Dakota.

The new public safety tool, which the S.D. Department of Criminal Investigation has been working on, is an optional tool for school districts based on school safety concerns and is very similar to Project StandUp, which has been in place for anonymous drug tips since May of 2017.

"The Project StandUp for School Safety program will offer school districts another component to enhance safety in their school buildings," said ASBSD Executive Director Wade Pogany. "Students' safety and well-being, both mentally and physically, is the top priority of school districts."

Project StandUp for School Safety is initiated by texting the word "safe" to 82257. The submitting individual will then receive a follow up text message with eight questions that, once answered, will result in an email being immediately distributed with the submitted information to select school officials, School Resource Officers and local law enforcement that were designated by the district and the law enforcement upon implementation of the program. These officials will then respond with appropriate measures. Listed below are the current questions:

1. Thank you for contacting Project Stand Up. Your identity is 100% protected. In what State is this crime/threat taking place? (Please use 2 letter abbreviation)
2. Please be aware, that falsely reporting a crime can result in your criminal conviction. What is the full name of the school where this threat is taking place?
3. If this is an emergency that requires an urgent and immediate response call 9-1-1 (or your local law enforcement)! If this is not an emergency, type "NEXT".
4. In what City is this violent crime or threat taking place?
5. What is the full name of the person or persons you are concerned about committing violence? (For multiple names use a comma to separate each full name).
6. Please describe in DETAIL the violent, unusual or threatening behavior that you wish to report.
7. If an address or a relevant picture is available (photo, license plate #, text, screen shot), please provide it OR, type "NEXT".
8. This is an anonymous platform; however, if you are willing to be contacted by law enforcement, reply "YES". If not, reply "NO".
9. Thank you for standing up for School Safety. Spread the word, tell your friends about "82257/SAFE". Your tip was just forwarded to authorities.


