Playoffs hopes increase

The Corsica Comets kept their record perfect by defeating the Plankinton/White Lake Warriors 71-26.

Corsica started the scoring early. Trav De Lange started the scoring on a 14 yard run, Jason Broughton scored from 21 yds out, and Rob Bertram rambled in from 22 yards to conclude first period scoring.

Bertram scored twice in the second period on runs of three and 18 yards.

After intermission Corsica started where they left off. Rob Bertram pounded in from two yards out and one yard and Jason Broughton struck from one yard out, and Trav De Lange scored on a 20 yrd run.

In the fourth quarter Corsica scored on a 15 yard Vance Sorell to Craig Ehrich pass.

Corsica gained 395 yards on the ground and 102 yards by the air for a total of 497 yards on offense. Leading the ground attack for Corsica was Rob Bertram who had five touchdowns and 161 yards on 17 carries and Trav De Lange collected two touchdowns and 110 yards on 9 totes. Jason Broughton connected on six of eight attempted passes for 87 yards. Vance Sorell completed one of four for 15 yards and a

touchdown.

Scoring for the Warriors were Brett Hoefert on a 38 yard pass from Troy Weller. Weller also scored on a one yard run, Scott Weich slipped in from six yards and Scott Kirsch scored from one yard out.

Troy Bamberg led defensively with eight tackles and a blocked punt. Jamie Rexwinkel recovered two fumbles for the Comets.

Richard Peters and B. J. Strouth led defense for White Lake/Plankinton with 13 and 12 tackles.

Corsica had a tough game due to the 125 yards of penalties.

Corsica plays Stickney next Friday at Stickney. This is the final regular season game.

The film's plot works well because it is so simple. Dundee
