As you may have noticed in last week's Corsica Globe's Letter to the Editor section, several CHS alumni were displeased. They were not admitted to the dance because they came too late. At last year's prom a rule was put into effect which stated that if you were not at the dance by a certain time, you would not be admitted. This is a good rule. For example, if we pay a band to start playing at 9:00 and no one shows up until 9:45, that is about one hour that the band played to no one but themselves.

What happened at the Homecoming dance is that the alumni who came back to town did not know what time to be at the dance or that this rule would be in effect. In some cases, alcohol may have played a part in the denial of admittance, but the mainstream of alumni were not intoxicated and were not let in because they simply didn't know about the rule due to a breakdown in communication between the alumni and the administration.

If this rule is to be used at future dances, it should be clearly stated what time everyone is to be at the dance if they want to be admitted. I'm sure if the time was clearly stated at this year's dance, all those who weren't admitted would have been there earlier.

We must remember that Homecoming is for the alumni. We need their support and want them to have pride in their alma matre, not to feel contempt against it.

Comets continue quest for play-offs

The Corsica Comets remained undefeated at 5-0 as they walked past Ethan 61-20 on the home field last Friday night in a CBH Conference game.

The Comets capitalized on Ethan mistakes, scoring their first two touchdowns after fumble recoveries, for a 30-0 lead at the end of the first quarter. Corsica's four first quarter touchdowns came on the ground. Rob Bertram started on a twelve yard run, Trav De Lange scored on runs of 15 and 20 yards, and Jason Broughton scored on a 23 yard run. Corsica scored three more times on the ground. Rob Bertram pounded in from three yards, Ron Cruz powered in from 11 yards, and Ed Kuil scored from five yards out.

Jason Broughton threw for two touchdowns. He connected on an 11 yard toss to Trav De Lange in the second quarter and an 18 yard pass to Jason Evans in the third quarter.

The Corsica offense came up with a total of 393 yards, 337 yards on the ground and 45 via the air route.

Trav De Lange led the ground attack with three touchdowns, 102 yards on six carries; Jason

Evans earned one touchdown and 82 yards on six totes; and Rob Bertram carried the ball seven times, earning 55 yards and two touchdowns.

Jason Broughton completed three of his eight attempted passes for 32 yards and two touchdowns. Vance Sorell completed four of four passes for 19 yards.

Les Schoon booted a field goal extra point following the touchdown of Ron Cruz.

Corsica collected nine first downs with one by pass, one by penalty, and seven by rushing.

Ethan scored on a three and eleven yard run by Clay Caylor. Caylor also threw a 22 yards pass to Tom Puetz. Dave Gramm came up with a safety for Ethan's two points.

Corsica was led on defense by Ed Kuil with eight tackles. Jason Broughton and Vance Sorell came up with interceptions. They returned them 15 and 22 yards.

Corsica will play Mt. Vernon/Letcher at Mt. Vernon October 10 in a CBH Conference game.
