'Butterfly' advances to state competition

The cast of the play, "I Never Saw Another Butterfly" after winning the local competition, went on to the regional competition in Armour and placed second which qualifies them for state. They will now go to the state play competition in Sioux Falls which will take place on February 5-7.

The play was a story of how Jewish children lived and communicated in the World War II concentration camp of Terazin. Terazin was the last stop of the Jews on their way to Auschwitz, where most were killed. The story was told as seen through the eyes of Raja (Ri-ja) played by Alice Kuil. In the end Raja alone survives.

The play's director Karen Clark commented, "The cast

did the best they have done up to this point. The judges gave us some suggestions that we will be implementing for our performance in Sioux Falls. I was very pleased with their performance!"

The cast was made up of Alice Kuil as Raja, Sheila Reimnitz as Irene (ear-ray-na), Dan Bosma as Honza (Hont'-za), and Stephanie Bakker, Darci Eggers, Kelly Wagner, make up a group of children who lived in Terazin. The student directors are Traci Vanden Berge and Steve Pickart and the crew was made up of Scott Menning and Pat Dockendorf.

Jason Broughton to be honored at Corn Palace

The Joe Robbie Most Valuable Player Award is given to the MVP of each championship game. Robbie has been honoring the outstanding player from the five championship games since its start in 1981.

Joe Robbie is a native of Sisseton, South Dakota. He graduated from USD with a law degree in 1946. Robbie was the national fundraiser for the Dakota Dome.

Jason Broughton was chosen to receive the award (which is chosen by the South Dakota Sports' Writers Association) for the 1986 9B championship game. Broughton earned the award when he led the Comets

to victory over Hitchcock-Tulare in the Dakota Dome. Broughton carried the ball 13 times for 84 yards and one touchdown. He passed for 94 yards completing five of eight passes; he also threw one interception. Jason will receive his award when Corsica plays Avon at the Corn Palace on February 5.

Broughton also received the award for the outstanding running back. He also was chosen to the 9B All-State team.

Winners of the Joe Robbie Award last year were Bria Tate (Brandon Valley), Gen Elrod (Sioux Falls O'Gorman), Garin Martin (Scotland), Deli Horn (Armour), and Chuck West (Tripp).

Comets claim two CBH victories

The Corsica Comets took another victory this year as they defeated Letcher 76-61. Corsica took the lead in the second half and never slowed down.

The Comets were plagued early when senior guard Jason Broughton landed wrong and injured his ankle.

Corsica was led in scoring by Scott Menning who netted 20, Dave Van Roekel laced 15, and Vance Sorell contributed 11. The Comets netted 18 of 35 attempts from the line for 50% and laced 29 of 53 shots from the field for 55%.

The rebounding was a key factor as Corsica grabbed 43 rebounds. Dave Van Roekel grabbed 15 and Scott Menning added 12. The team committed 15 turnovers.

Letcher was led in scoring by Mark Hoffman who laced 24, Pat Ruml added 17, and Miles Northrup had 11. The Tigers shot 39% from the field making 17 of 44 attempts and they shot 76% from the charity line

making 25 of 33 attempted shots.

The Tigers grabbed 31 rebounds as a team. Mark Hoffman grabbed nine, Greg Latza added eight, and Pat Ruml had four.

Corsica was led in scoring by Scott Menning who netted 22 and Troy Bamberg added 11. The Comets shot 31% from the field making 14 of 45 attempts. They made 11 of 22 shots from the charity stripe for 50%.

The Comets grabbed 36 rebounds. Scott Menning grabbed 10, Troy Bamberg and Trav De Lange each had eight. Corsica committed 10 turnovers.

Corsica's upcoming games are against Parkston on the 27th and White Lake on the 30th and Avon on the 5th.
