# "PITFALL" PRESENTED

## CAST SELECTED FOR SENIOR CLASS PLAY



"Operation Pitfall" was presented in the school auditorium on March 4 at 2:30 P. M.

Five inmates from the South Dakota Penitentiary at Sioux Falls very impressivel ly described the "pitfalls"in each of their lives. They told of events leading up to their present, sentences in the state prison.

Most larger crimes are triggered by instances such as shoplifting, lying, and consuming alcoholic beverages when in the teen years as was the case in the lives of the five inmates.

Points brought out were the need for teen agers to recognize responsibility, respect authority, use opportunities for self-improvement, get a good education, and use it beneficially.

8. Be a "Contented" driver as traffic in-


