## Science Fair Held at CHS

Friday evening, March 29, the science department presented projects for viewing by the public. The science fair, held from 7:00-8:00 p.m., consisted of projects completed by the biology and physics students.

Mr. Burris judged the students' projects and awarded first place to Sandy Bamburg and Vicki Dykstra in the biology class; and to Elaine Van Zee and Mary DeVries in the physics class.

The project completed by Sandy and Vicki dealt with the effects of selenium injected into chick embryos. Mary and Elaine developed negatives, and had on display several pictures which they had developed.

## WHY SHOULDN'T THERE BE PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOR EVERYONE AT CORSICA PERFECT SCHOOL?

At the present time, we devote two periods of school time; that is, one and one-half hours, to athletics. We only devote 45 minutes each for English, science, and history. Does that mean that athletics are twice as important as the required subjects?

This one and one-half hour for athletics is used by approximately 30 students, while approximately 100 students have to suffer in the study hall. Why shouldn't these 100 receive the same physical benefits?

How many of our 30 students will continue on with basketball, football, or track after they graduate from our athletic-minded school and carry it along as a profession?

Why shouldn't golf, bowling, archery, and even fishing be included for everyone? These are forms of recreation which the average person will enjoy after he graduates.

By placing the emphasis where it properly belongs, the educational program might be considerably improved.

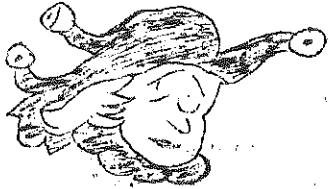
