For the second year CHS has won the CBH Science Contest. The Science Contest is only in its second year.

Corsica competed against other CBH schools which include Plankinton, Eihan, Stickney, Mt. Vernon, Kimball, White Lake, Artesian and Letcher.

Medals were given to the first three places in each division. Final results for Corsica were Physics, Donna Olson, 1st; Chemistry, Kris Bordewyk, 1st, Karol Spaans, 2nd, Les Plooster, 3rd; Biology, Kathy Olawsky, 2nd, Rick Vanden Hoek, 3rd. Olawsky tied for first but a flip

of the coin gave her second place.

Norman Lien, CHS science instructor, said he spent a lot of time last year reviewing with the students. This year no time was taken to review. "I especially felt good this year," said Lien, "...kids had to review on their own."

## CHS competes in Quiz Bowl at USD

Four Corsica High School students recently competed in the University of South Dakota's High School Bowl competition. The CHS players played three other schools to place eighth.

The High School Bowl uses the same format and rules as the College Bowl game. Hundreds of colleges and universities have the bowl games as an intramural sport.

The questions used in the High School Bowl range the subjects of art to mythology to

sports. All the questions used are researched and authenticated by "Time" magazine.

The two types of questions used are the toss-up and bonus questions. The toss-up is worth 10 points each for the team whose player firsts answers correctly. The bonus questions are worth a stated number of points from 20 to 30 which the team confers on its answer. The game is played in halves, with two teams of four students each. Twenty schools competed

in the all day event. Corsica competed against Hamlin County, Salem and Bon Homme.

Jefferson and Bon Homme competed against each other for the championship. Bon Homme won the championship game.

CHS participants in the bowl games were Donna Olson, Debbie Olivier, Karol Spaans and Gloria Everson. Alternates were Kathy Olawsky and Sheila Reimnitz.

The 1985 Junior-Senior Prom was held April 12 at the elementary gym.

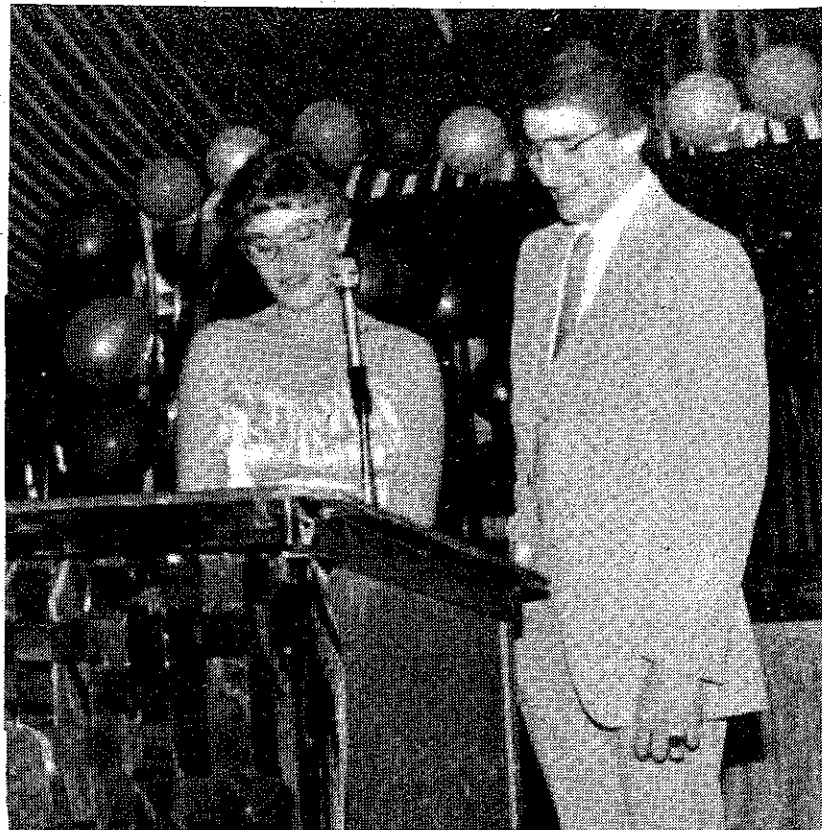
