

The lecturer, Leon Lamprecht, is a specialist on African affairs; His lectures are repea edly praised for providing "in depth" information on the people and problem of Africa.


been born Having eduacated and Zululand, he possessès an extensive knowledge of the language, rainfall, climate, customs and history of the area.
