Corsica defeated Geddes there October 20 by a score of 59-0. Rocky Maunders started the scoring in the game with a run of 15 yards. A touchdown on a run of 41 yards by Doyle Bertram and an extra point by Alan Zwart wrapped up the scoring in the first quarter.

In the second quarter the scoring was by Doyle Bertram on a 52-yard run, by Dwight Bordewyk on a 29-yard run, and by Brent Beukelman on a 2-yard run. Alan Zwart got the extra point.

The freshman-sophomore team saw about 4 minutes of action during the first half.

The only touchdown in the third quarter was gained by Dwight Bordewyk on a 52-yard run with Dan Walters getting the extra point.

SOPHOMORE CLASS

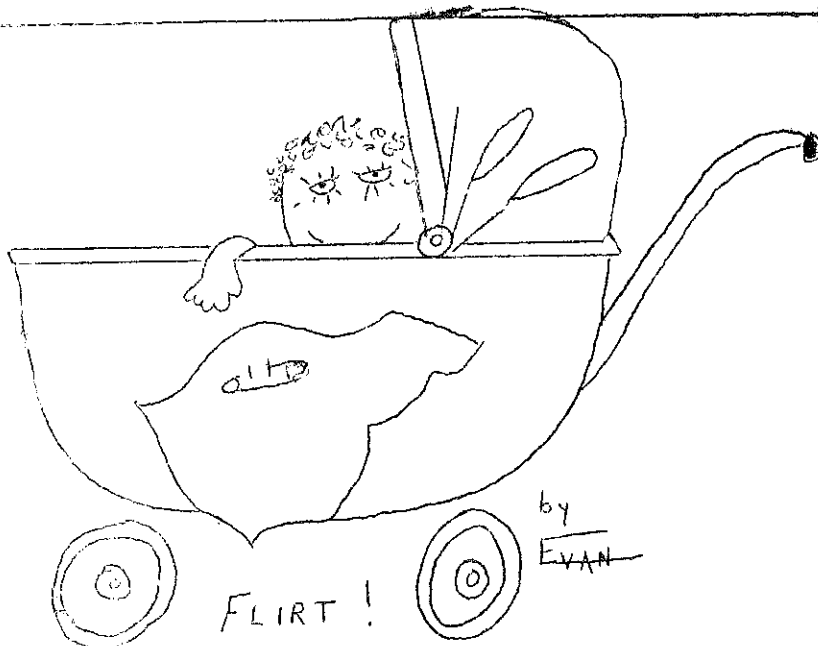
The sophomore class wants to congratulate the football team on their successful season. (Hats off to you fellas.) May our basketball season be a successful one, too.
