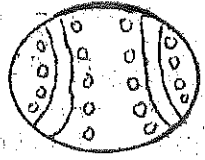
## BENEFIT BASKETBALL GAME

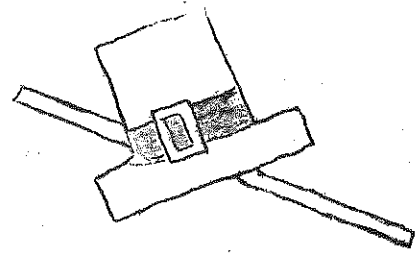

# CLASS NEWS



## SCIENCE CLASSES

The biology class is incubating eggs.

They are checking them to show their growth. They are studying about mammals, have finished their pictures and are now working on their projects for the "Science Fair".

The chemistry class is studying the Halogen family. Each class is again doing experiments. The six are entitled, (1) compounds of sodium and potassium (2) flame test for metals (3) preparation and properties of chlorine (4) preparation and properties of hydrochloric acid (5) preparation and properties of bromine and (6) preparation and properties of iodine.

The chemistry classes are also thinking about and working on their projects for the "Science Fair."

The freshman science class is studying about the different machines such as wedges, screws, levers and the inclined plane. They are learning how man first learned to use machines to help him do his work. They are to make a project of some kind to go along with what they already have studied in science.

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## ENGLISH CLASSES

The Freshman class has been drilling on grammar almost all year. This semester, however, they have 1 day a week devoted to Literature and this week they have been giving panel discussion.

This Semester the Sophomores are studying Speech. They have learned how important facila expressions are in speech by giving 1 min. pantomines. The past few days have been spent trying to help the students improve his voice by doing vocal exercises and taping their voice over the tape. They will soon begin giving 2-4 min. informative speeches.

The Juniors have been divided into sections. The college prep class has been writing a theme every two weeks since the beginning of the 2nd semester and will continue to do so until the end of the year. They have also been doing some creative writing with their first short story due this week. In between their writing assignments they've been reading works of famous American authors.

The seniors are divided into 2 section. The College prep class has been writing themes and studying 8th century Eng. Lit. In

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the other section the students have been reading books and must hand in a written book report. This week the entire class however, has been reading the Senior Class play, "Little Women."

## GERMAN

We have just completed studying the endings and use of the der and ein words.

Norm L. don't you know any better than to get picked up on a Wednesday nite after going to church.

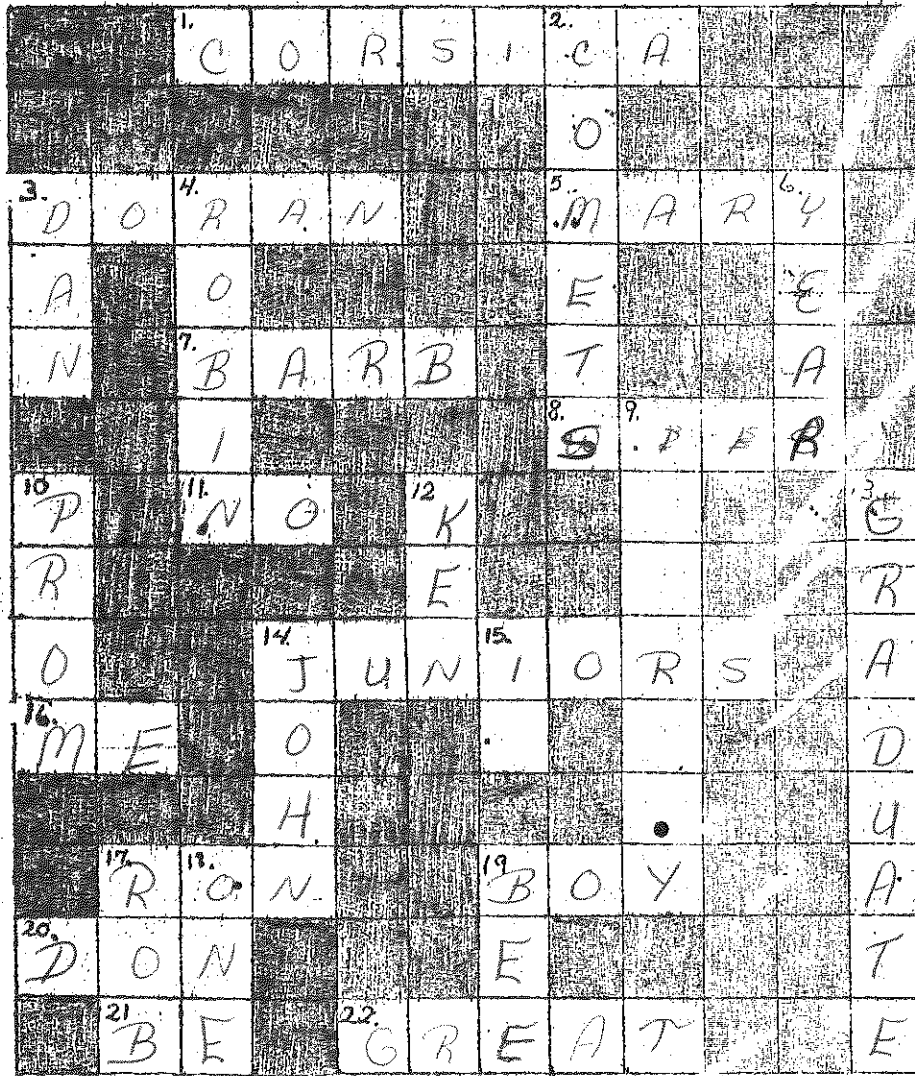
